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“Happy New Year”

Welcome to the first newsletter of 2016. Happy New Year to all members and friends. Our first report takes us back to the AGM.

Annual General Meeting

The 16th Annual General Meeting was held at Northall Village Hall on Friday 13th November 2015, and the meeting started promptly at 7.30pm as our Chairman David Ball welcomed some 28 members. Secretary Roger Stroud gave apologies for absence.

There were no matters arising. The minutes of the 2014 AGM were then duly approved.

We had circulated the Officers' Reports with the AGM Agenda Pack before the meeting therefore they were not repeated verbatim, but updated as appropriate.

David Ball added that he was retiring. He had enjoyed his five years as Chairman and went on to thank his fellow officers, committee and all members for their help and support over the years.

Roger Stroud added that one of the best aspects of our

club was the social play - he mentioned seeing one of our newer members attempt and make a good jump shot over one of the top players in the club - the look of surprise and pleasure was excellent - and of course a number of our members also enjoy more competitive events.

Len Buckingham, our Treasurer, explained that there had been a delay in our Accounts Examiner finalising the accounts due to illness, however this would be sorted shortly. He stated that he had been Treasurer for over a decade and would be retiring as soon as the club's new license with the Council, due to commence April 2017, was set up. He added that we had received written information from the Town Council's Head of Grounds and Environmental Services that our new licence will not contain a clause saying that the club would be responsible for the total rent due for the duration of the licence if the club was to fail during the licence period.

Len added that we have received three keys to enable Blue Badge holders to access the 'cricket' car park - we await designated parking places. to be marked. We are

also in negotiation with the Council to provide security fencing around all three lawns. The committee has agreed that the club will make some contribution to the cost of the fencing.

The Officers' reports were duly accepted by the meeting.

Len proposed no increase in subscription for the 2016 season. Len also stated that 2016 would be his last year as Treasurer and he requested that all members start thinking about the need for someone to come forward to take on this post.

The Chairman then stepped down and handed over to Secretary Roger Stroud who explained that we had two nominations for Chairman - John Thorp and Malcolm Kirby. A paper vote was organised by Membership Secretary Judith Cundell and member Mary Kemp. The result was a majority decision for Malcolm Kirby to be the new Chairman. Malcolm took the Chair and asked for a round of applause for our retiring Chairman.

Whilst the vote was being determined, Roger had announced that he was standing as Secretary and Len Buckingham as Treasurer. The following were nominated as committee members - John Cundell, John Thorp, Sally Clay, Sheila Guest, Ross Bagni, Val Jeffers and Mary Kemp. They were duly proposed, seconded and accepted.

during the season and the winner of a bottle of wine was Phil Rowe.

In 'Any Other Business', Tom Miller firstly thanked David Ball for his Chairmanship. He went on to say that Richard Keighley and John Cundell should be congratulated and thanked for their excellent Golf Croquet Coaching Manual that they had produced for the Croquet Association. This reflected well on our club.

John Thorp said that the club tends to rely on just a few members who carry out all event preparation, whether or not they are taking part in the day's proceedings. If a member is taking part in an event, it would be much appreciated if he or she could turn out earlier rather than arriving at the start time, to assist setting up.

John Cundell added that both he and John Thorp were pleased with the extra help they had received this Autumn concerning lawn maintenance from both male and female members. Thanks to all concerned.

Our new Chairman, Malcolm stated that when he ran his company he had an open-door policy where if anybody had anything to say, then do so to him or one of our committee members.

His second point was that we need new members, particularly younger, and asked if anyone has any ideas. Tony Wells asked why we do not have reports in the local newspaper. Judith Cundell responded that our reports were not always published, and when they were they were always 'edited' - often incorrectly. David Ball said he would try again next season. Ross Bagni said that The Croquet Association was holding a National Croquet Day on 5th June 2016, a day on which the public will be encouraged to try croquet anywhere in the country. It was agreed we should support this.

Sally Clay felt that our website was one of the best places to advertise the club.

Sheila Beal mentioned the train days held by the Leighton Buzzard Railway, and John Thorp added that we should look at providing advertising boards alongside the fence for such occasions. Tom Miller added that on these occasions we should not wear whites to forstall the image that to play our game such clothing was a requirement.

Malcolm suggested we should look as the special market days where a stall can be taken to advertise the club.

Malcolm gave the date for the Annual Dinner, 11th

March 2016, at Leighton Buzzard Golf Club. Details are later in this newsletter.

Malcolm also reminded members of the Social Club held on every Wednesday morning at Page's Park Pavilion - costing just £2.50.

Malcolm then thanked all who had attended the meeting, those who had provided the buffet food; Len Buckingham for arranging the hall; those who had set up the tables, etc.; David Ball for organising the raffle - and past member Tony Stammers who had kindly sold and folded all the raffle tickets.

National Croquet Day - 5th June

This event mentioned above in the Diary Dates is an initiative by The Croquet Association for a day on which the public will be encouraged and be able to try croquet anywhere in the country. It is a project coordinated by The Croquet Association Marketing Team and the key objectives include:

- Showing that croquet is a game for everyone.
- Showing that croquet is a sport with a competitive edge.
- Providing an opportunity to motivate people to visit their local club to try 'The Croquet Experience'.
- Grasping an opportunity to dispel negative and inaccurate images of croquet.

In the run-up to the day, The Croquet Association will send out a series of national press releases to arouse public interest, and clubs could both support and capitalise on this by aligning a Club Open Day and publicity to this media interest. We shall be supporting this at Page's Park.

Leighton-Linslade GC B-Level Tournament - 18th June

This competition was initiated in 2014 by Chris Roberts, the Editor of The Croquet Gazette, to try and bring a climax to the series of B-Level Tournaments held throughout the country. Chris's idea was to enlarge the competition by getting more clubs to take part and rationalising the events to allow play from the same handicap. This was finalised and the handicap level was 3-8.

Winners of each round automatically qualified for a two-day final at the end of the year. The whole series was very well supported in 2014 and even more successful last year. Chris Roberts reports in The Croquet Association Gazette that the 2015 series enjoyed full or oversubscribed fields at 15 of its 18 tournaments - including ours. Even with the loss of some of the regular players, who no longer qualify for its handicap of 3 to 8 restriction - including our David Ball and John Thorp, it's difficult to imagine that the popularity of this series will do anything other than improve still further this year.

The national roster increases by one more tournament in 2016, with the addition of Budleigh Salterton as a 19th qualifier, all leading towards the end of season National Final, which will also be at Budleigh.

The full list this year has events at: Sussex, Watford, Wrest Park, Ealing, Northampton, Leighton-Linslade,

Colchester, Hunstanton, Bury, Nottingham, Bath, Middlesbrough, Hamptworth, Guildford, Phyllis Court, Ashby, Budleigh, Hurlingham and Edgbaston.

There is also a growing list of other clubs wanting to join the B-Level Series and these will also be listed as stand-alone events in The CA fixtures book.

Our round in the 2015 tournament received twelve entries from other clubs - and two from our own club - one of which, Roger Stroud, won against some excellent competition. The event was successful and we received a number of kind remarks from the competitors for an excellent competition and for our overall management of the day - also our scoring system was well liked. Many of the competitors remarked how nice it was to see so many club members supporting the day.

To play in any of these events you need to join The Croquet Association as a Tournament Member. You can find information about this at www.croquet.org.uk and click on the 'CA Information' tab. New tournament members pay an introductory rate of £14.50 for single and £22.50 for dual membership in their first year. In the second year the rate is two-thirds of the full rate prevailing at that time. The full rate applies from the third year of membership - £48.50 for single and £73 for dual.

Leighton-Linslade High Handicap (C-Level) Tournament - 15th July

The C-Level tournament is aimed specifically at those players whose handicap falls between 9-12, designed to give the less experienced player a chance to play in open competition, and hopefully to tempt them into entering more senior Croquet Association events.

We ran such an event at Page's Park last year to try and encourage some of our members to take part as well as inviting entrants from other local clubs. This was organised similarly to the B-Level Tournament. To get entries initially proved a little difficult, however with some arm twisting and gentle persuasion, we ended up with twelve entries - five from outside clubs and seven from LLCC. There was a small entry fee.

The event was much enjoyed by all competitors and resulted in some exciting croquet from all concerned throughout an enjoyable, friendly and sociable day's play. We look forward to the good news being spread back to our visitors' clubs and to other clubs in the area and that we receive a good entry in 2016.

EACF Leagues

The 2016 East Anglian Croquet Federation's League competitions will be run to a similar format to last year. At the moment it looks like there will be six teams in North & Mid Area, six in the Central Area, five in the Eastern Area, and six in the Western Area - our area - comprised of Watford, Stony Stratford, Wrest Park, Northampton Hoops, Northampton Mallets and Leighton-Linslade.

For those not aware of the 2015 results, the Handicap League was won by Hunstanton, and the Level League by Colchester.

The selection committee for EACF League teams this year will be John Cundell, David Ball and John Thorp.

Lawn Maintenance

In our fifth year of looking after the lawns during the close season, we are becoming more proficient and knowledgeable as to what needs to be done to maintain, and over the longer term to improve, our lawns. We are also accumulating the necessary equipment by purchase - in 2015 a second rotary mower and a scarifier - or borrowing/hiring to help us carry out the work required. At this point we would like to thank the Town Council and particularly the Head Groundsman Doug Bolton for assisting us in the loan of some of the Council's equipment.

Tuesday 27th October saw four members of our Lawn Maintenance Group mowing all three lawns which had grown considerably since the end of our playing season. At the same time as our work was progressing, two members of the Town Council's groundstaff were strimming around all three of our fences and were removing the spoil and the mounds of leaves. Work started just before 10.00am and finished at 13.00. We were so lucky with the weather, giving us firm lawns and even some late morning and afternoon sun, resulting in almost short sleeve temperatures not far short of 20 degrees! As Malcolm remarked "I'd rather be warm than cold and wet!"

Thanks to, in alphabetical order - Sheila Beal, John Cundell, Malcolm Kirby and John Thorp.

A second mowing was required in November due to the continuing unseasonable warm weather. The weather was wet as the small team arrived at 9.45am, however the rain stopped around 10.00am and the team managed to mow all three lawns plus maintenance on some small areas which needed re-seeding and top dressing. Work started with lawn 3, then lawn 2 - and finished on lawn 1 around 12.30pm as the heavy rain started.

Due to the continuing warm conditions, at least one more mow is now well overdue and will be attempted as soon as we get a couple of dry days!

Council and Fencing Situation

The previous newsletter carried the following paragraph:

'After a meeting with the Town Clerk and the Head of Grounds and Environmental Services in August, we have reached the following stage. It is proposed to erect a new 1.8 metre high green mesh fence around all three croquet lawns. Quotations for this work are in hand by the Town Council, following which there will be a proposal put forward to the Leisure and Community Committee (L&CC) meeting - hopefully in November. If this is approved, the bulk of the cost will be borne by the Town Council - our club will be offering a contribution towards the cost. We should know more by the time of our Annual General Meeting.'

Unfortunately we didn't know more by the AGM as the application was not put before the L&CC in November or December. The next meeting is in early February - we live in hope!

Croquet in Corfu

The Corfu Croquet Club, in conjunction with the Kontokali Bay Hotel & Resort, has organised its first GC Croquet Holiday, following several very successful AC events. Richard Thompson, who manages the very well run Edgbaston events, is managing this event, to be known as the 'First Greek GC Championship' - to be held from 4th to 13th May 2016.

Corfu is a Greek island in the Ionian Sea. It has an area of 600 sq km and a population of 112,000. This lovely, green island, steeped in history and antiquities, has long been a popular holiday destination. The temperature in May will typically be mid twenties C.

The Croquet Club of Corfu is the first croquet club in Greece and was set up in 2006 at Kontokali, 7km north of Corfu town. It is beside a marina and well positioned for hotels and restaurants. The club has three lawns of a good standard, in idyllic settings. The croquet programme will be flexible, and will not be just a croquet tournament, it will be a croquet-based holiday with friends.
